



Daisy Scarf

(Fully Reversible and Doesn't Roll)

Materials:

Needles Size 11, 3 Skeins (100 gram each) of O-Wool Legacy Bulky Weight Yarn (certified organic, shown in Charcoal 6752 & available from www.daisyyarns.com), One Cable Hook, One Yarn Needle, One Stitch Counter and Stitch Markers

A. Set Up Using Cable Cast on Method

Cast on 2 place marker, cast on 8 place marker, cast on 2 place marker, cast on 8 place marker, cast on 2 place marker, cast on 8 place marker, cast on 2 = 32 stitches

Set Up Row 1: K1, P1, (K2, P2, K2, P2), K2, (K2, P2, K2, P2), K2, (K2, P2, K2, P2), P1, K1

Set Up Row 2: K1, P1, (P2, K2, P2, K2), K2, (P2, K2, P2, K2), K2, (P2, K2, P2, K2), P1, K1

B. Pattern Rows of 12, Set Stitch Counter to 1 and at end of each row turn to keep track of rows!

Row 1: K1, P1, (Cable 8 Front "R" Style see below), K2, (Cable 8 Front "R" Style see below), K2, (Cable 8 Front "R" Style see below), P1, K1

Row 2-12: K1, P1, (K2, P2, K2, P2), K2, (K2, P2, K2, P2), K2, (K2, P2, K2, P2), P1, K1

Start over with Row 1 – 12 until piece measures 50" or desired length. Bind off final stitches and weave in loose ends with Yarn Needle.

Cable 8 Front "Reverse" Style = (place 4 stitches on cable hook and hold in front, from Left Needle Knit 2, Purl 2, go to stitches on the Cable Hook and Knit 2, Purl 2)

Helpful Hint: K= Knit stitch (yarn is always in the back) P = Purl stitch (yarn is always in the front).

Note: After my tester revealed this to me in person, I was in total awe. It was so much better than the original. By the way, the pattern is exactly the same but with much better organic yarn. I have to confess one day in the financial district when it was first released, I was talking to someone who knitting this pattern. When I mentioned I designed this, at first didn't believe me I think...because she kept giving me the description over and over and my website!
